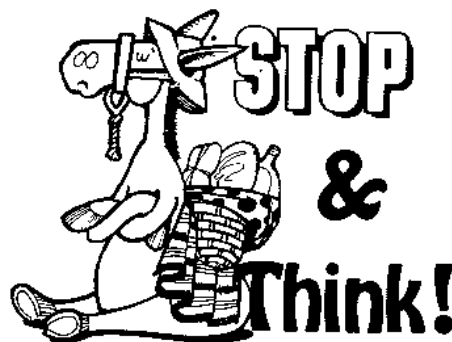

**TUNE-UP CLINIC**

CLINIC SCHEDULED FOR JAN 22

Your Club's sixth annual tune-up clinic will be held on SATURDAY MORNING, JANUARY 22, 1983 at the QTH of Mike Santana, WB6TEB. Mike has again volunteered to help keep our signals the best on the VHF bands and for no charge at all he will test your rigs using professional test equipment as follows:

**Transmitter -**

- Output frequency
- Voice deviation
- Touchtone deviation
- Output power
- Spurious outputs(spectrum analyzer)

**Receiver -**

- IF and discriminator alignment
- Receive frequencies
- Receive sensitivity (SINAD)
- Spurious responses (if a problem)

Please remember to bring your instruction books with the location of all trimmers and adjustments, and your list of channels -vs- frequencies for crystal-controlled rigs. While intended to be a quick test-and-adjust session, there will be a limited facility for minor repairs and recheck.

As usual, doughnuts will be provided by the club and Elvia, HK4CVV, will provide the Colombian coffee. The clinic will take place from 9am to 12 noon in Mike's garage at 1050 Monte Verde Drive, Arcadia.

Coming from the west, take the 210 Freeway to the Michillinda exit. At the bottom of the exit ramp, make a left onto Colorado Blvd. Continue past Michillinda to Altura; turn right on Altura and go South to first stop sign. Mike is on the SE corner of Altura and Monte Verde.

Coming from the east, take the 210 Freeway to the Michillinda exit. At the end of the exit ramp (in front of Sears) make a right and go along Foothill Blvd to Michillinda. Make a right on Michillinda, and go under the freeway to Colorado Blvd. Make a left onto Colorado and go east 1 block to Altura. **DX NEWS by Bob, N6ET**

Happy New Year to all you DXers. I hope that you all had a fabulous time over the Christmas holidays working new countries one after another. I was lucky to catch up with W6OAT operating as 9N1OAT, in Nepal on 20 CW. It was a banner day! This week the Long Island DX Bulletin is full of good news which I will share with you.

Crozet Island - FB8WI has been active on 14015-020 and 14100-110 kHz between 1600 & 2100Z. He and FB8WH plan daily schedules in the future.

Iraq - Y11BGD has been more active lately at 14215 to 14220 kHz especially on Friday & Saturday. Look for them in the following time slots: 0100-0200, 0400-0730, and 1300 to 1700Z. W1FZ now handles QSLs.

Kerguelen Island - FB8XAB has been heard at 21171kHz @ 1800Z, 14105kHz @ 1700&2100Z and on 40 cw.

Qatar - A71BJ frequents 28545 kHz daily from 1400Z. This a bit early for W6-land, but it's winter and I've heard Saudi Arabia on 28 MHz only slightly later in past years.

Rodriguez Island - 3B9DA is active through May on both phone and CW. Alex usually can be found in the low 25kHz of 20 meters in the CW band.

Heard Island - VKOJS, VKONL, VKOSJ and others should be on their way to this out-of-the-way place now. Two DXpeditions are expected to be active simultaneously starting prior to mid-January. Work them now, as it will be a long time until the next operation.

When tennis shoes come his way.

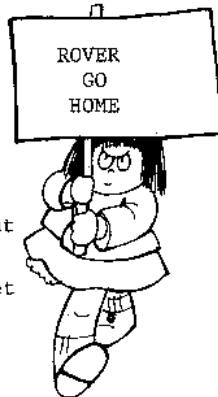
The owners think he's awfully cute.
